The Dalhousie Faculty of Dentistry was founded in 1908 and is located in the Dentistry Building on University Avenue. It houses one of the most modern dental clinic and laboratory facilities for student instructions in Canada. The majority of the course offerings are taught in the building with the medical science classes taught by departments in the Faculty of Medicine.

The educational programme is supplemented by clinics and demonstrations in Metro hospitals and in Faculty-operated community-based dental clinics. These arrangements enable students to obtain extensive, varied clinical instruction and experience. Faculty members are actively involved in basic, clinical, and educational research. Many students are offered summer research studentships during their course of study.

The DDS curriculum emphasizes the integration of the biological, behavioral and dental sciences. Introduction to patient treatment begins in the first year of the program with major emphasis on the biological and behavioral sciences as applied to dentistry. Clinical patient treatment receives greater emphasis in the second year with continued emphasis on integration of the biological and behavioral sciences. Clinically oriented disciplines receive major emphasis in the third year to prepare students to practice "total patient care", a general dentistry philosophy, in the final year.

In 1967, the Board of Laval University approved, in principle, the foundation of a Dentistry School (Ecole d'art dentaire, whose name was changed to Ecole de m decine dentaire in 1970). The School offered a B.Sc. program in Health Sciences with the mention "M decine dentaire". As far as teaching was concerned, the School was part of the Health Sciences Sector.

In 1971, the School enrolled its first students, 10 males. The enrolment rate increased rapidly over the next 20 years. Today, no fewer than 972 dentists have graduated at Laval University. The majority practise their profession in the Province of Quebec, particularly in the East of the Province.

The clinical and intra-university practice organizations are particularly complex. Within the Laval University context, the importance of the discipline is distinguished from that of other Dentistry Faculties in the Province and in Canada. The quality of the training provided in the first year of the graduate program and in dental and maxillofacial surgery, the specialised training activities in dentistry, in medicine as well as in science and engineering conducted by professors in dentistry, and the research completed within the framework of the Oral Ecology Research Group are among the components which predicate the granting of Faculty status to the School.

As an arm's length entity, the School of Dentistry is required to operate as a Faculty. The structure of its administration as well as of its program leave it free from any Faculty guardianship. Its higher studies call for a major commitment on the part of the faculty staff, which is how a specialised dental and maxillofacial surgery programme came to be developed. Furthermore, in April 1992, the University Board resolved to offer a postgraduate degree in multidisciplinary dentistry.

Since 1982, the School's research initiatives have been focused on oral biochemistry-microbiology and on clinical research. In 1989, the Laval University Board recognized the Oral Ecology Research Group as a multi-faculty research centre.

All of the above factors, in addition to the team spirit which has always driven both the teaching and non-teaching staff of the School, prompted the University authorities to recognize the excellence of the teaching and research at the Ecole de m decine dentaire by granting it Faculty status in June 1992.

The Faculty is offering a Masters degree in dental sciences and graduate programs in maxillofacial surgery, gerontology and periodontics.

In 1925, the Royal College formally relinquished the teaching function to permit the School to become a Faculty of the University of Toronto.

The Faculty is now the largest dental school in Canada. Not only does it graduate approximately 70 qualified dentists each year, but it also educates specialists in Orthodontics, Pediatric Dentistry, Endodontics, Periodontology, Prosthodontics, Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and Anesthesia, Dental Anesthesia, Oral Pathology, Oral Radiology and Dental Public Health. It also provides future teachers of dentistry to universities across Canada through its M.Sc. and Ph.D. programs.

The undergraduate dental curriculum at the University of Western Ontario is a four year program of 32 weeks in length, leading to the Doctor of Dental Surgery (DDS) degree. The educational format is a blend of lectures, laboratory exercises, small group problem-based learning, and supervised clinical experience. Students may be admitted into the first year of Dentistry from a variety of educational backgrounds, provided that the minimum requirements for admission are satisfied. A two-year Internationally Trained Dentists program prepares graduates of non-accredited dental programs for the qualifying examinations of the National Dental Examining Board of Canada. Up to twelve students are admitted annually. Graduate Training

Schulich Dentistry offers a Graduate Program in Orthodontics of 36 months duration leading to a Master of Clinical Dentistry (MCID) degree. Dental Education was instituted at the University of Alberta in 1917 in the School of Dentistry. In 1944 the School became the Faculty of Dentistry, with the introduction of the School of Dental Hygiene occurring in 1962. An innovative move in 1996 incorporated dentistry and dental hygiene into the Department of Oral Health Sciences, within the new Faculty of Medicine and Oral Health Sciences. Integrating oral health sciences with medicine has put the University of Alberta at the forefront of dental education in Canada and is an approach that recognizes oral health as an inherent part of total health. In 1998, the faculty's name was officially changed to the Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry.

The Department of Dentistry offers a four-year program of study leading to the Doctor of Dental Surgery degree, following satisfactory completion of at least two preprofessional years of University education. The Department offers a Diploma in Dental Hygiene Program, as well as a program leading to a BSc (Dental Hygiene Specialization). In addition, the Department of Dentistry offers an advanced placement DDS degree to a selected number of students who already possess a dental degree from a dental program recognized by the World Health Organization.

Graduate Programs include studies leading to MSc and PhD in Medical Sciences, MSc and PhD in Orthodontics and a Certificate in TMD/Orofacial Pain. Further details may be obtained from the Director, Graduate Studies and Research, Department of Dentistry.

Admission to the Faculty of Dentistry for the DMD degree is based primarily on academic ability, aptitude tests, letters of recommendation, personal statement and personal interviews.

The Faculty of Dentistry offers a Bachelor of Science (Dental Hygiene) degree through the Dental Hygiene Degree Program. (BDSc).

Graduate Training Programs

The Faculty of Dentistry offers post-graduate training in the clinical specialties of endodontics, orthodontics, pediatric dentistry and periodontics through dual program options that are done in conjunction with an MSc in Craniofacial Science as three-year programs. Diploma options in the clinical specialties of orthodontics and pediatric dentistry include dual programs in conjunction with a PhD in Craniofacial Science as a six-year program. The Faculty also offers MSc/PhD in Craniofacial Science programs that are researched based only with no clinical components.

Postgraduate Programs

ORAL MEDICINE AND ORAL PATHOLOGY POSTGRADUATE PROGRAM

In conjunction with the University-affiliated teaching hospitals, the Faculty offers postgraduate residency training in oral medicine and oral pathology. The program consists of a three or four-year hospital-based stipended residency in one of three pathways: oral medicine, oral pathology, or the combined specialties.

GENERAL PRACTICE RESIDENCY PROGRAM

This one-year dental residency program is offered in conjunction with university-affiliated teaching hospitals. These residency positions include one opening in pediatric dentistry.

The Departments of Dentistry of the Vancouver Hospital and Health Sciences Centre (12th and Oak site, and UBC site), the B.C. Cancer Agency and British Columbia Children's Hospital, offer a one-year General Practice Residency training program commencing each June.
